Pūkaha's Response

Pūkaha is one of New Zealand's best-equipped Outdoor Classrooms and a national treasure that can be nurtured and leveraged for the benefit of future generations and Aotearoa's environmental future.

Pūkaha's goal is to offer unique learning experiences that are sympathetic to the natural environment and it's inhabitants, that educate and inspire New Zealanders to be guardians of our environment and that reconnect us all with the mauri (life force) of the forest.

The Pūkaha Board has committed to building a purpose designed Education and Accommodation Centre and to invest in enhanced education programmes. Together they will take experiences available at Pūkaha to a whole new level.

The Centre, to be known as Te Wānanga Taiao, is currently being built on the Reserve





Te Wānanga Taiao



Te Wānanga Taiao will accommodate groups of up to 40 people including schools, community and business organisations.

The whare nui is a place of ceremony, of meeting and of learning that can also be used for overnight stays.

A commerical kitchen and beautiful dinning area will seat 100 people and be used as a lounge with log fire in the evenings. A special room to dry clothes is also included so everyone can enjoy the forest in all weathers and have warm dry clothes the next day.

Te Wānanga Taiao will enable visitor groups from all walks of life to come and stay at the Reserve overnight and get to experience the native forest at dawn and dusk when it really comes alive.

All access to the reserve will be by guided tours only including a new nocturnal aviary to see Kiwi in their natural outdoor habitat.

The Opportunity

We are offering you the opportunity to be part of this historic development and help make it happen.

The cost of the new Centre is \$6.5m.

We have received a government grant of \$3.7m.

We need to raise and invest \$2.8m to complete the project.

The Centre will be completed and open by June 2023.



The opportunities to participate financially include donations to sponsorship and collective contributions.

Donations

All donations gratefully received and publicly acknowledged. Pūkaha is a registered charity, so any donations can be claimed as tax deduction. The donations could be in cash or kind.
